Alzheimer's Association - \$1,000.00, Caregiver Telephone Support Group

To offer telephone support groups to caregivers who are unable to attend traditional in-person support group meetings twice a month.

Bell Tower Theater - \$1,000.00, Kids Take the Stage

To launch Bell Tower Productions Kids Take the Stage, a unique after-school program that helps kids in Kindergarten through Sixth Grade build confidence, self-esteem, and communications skills through the art of theater.

Clayton County Foundation - \$250.00, Education of sustainability for our health and well-being

To educate the residents of Clayton County through materials, meetings, posters and brochures on the opportunity for sustainability that endowments have to offer.

Consumer Credit Counseling - \$1,000.00, "Understanding Credit"

To provide the Greater Dubuque community with up-to-date education on topics from high school credit classes to the latest on bankruptcy, housing and gambling, all of which improve the community and assist all neighborhoods.

Dubuque Arboretum - \$1,000.00, Japanese Garden Gate and Wall Project

To design and implement the Japanese Garden gate and wall at the Dubuque Arboretum and Botanical Gardens.

Dubuque County Historical Society - \$1,000.00, Hey, That's My River! Environmental Education Program for Youth

To provide environmental education to local youth at the National Mississippi River Museum & Aquarium.

Dubuque Rescue Mission - \$820.00, The Mission Cook School

To help purchase a stove hood to meet licensing code in order to continue courses in the culinary arts and the Mission Cook School and begin a catering business to offer our students present employment, as well as practical training for future employment.

Four Mounds Foundation - \$4,000.00, Housing Education and Rehabilitation Training [HEART] Partnership

To support the HEART partnership, where they changing lives of today's youth by providing vocational construction training and education through the complete rehabilitation of blighted properties in Dubuque.

Girl Scouts of Little Cloud - \$1,750.00, Girl Scouts In Need

To remodel the main and assisted dining rooms and front lobby to enhance the social interaction of the Manor's residents and to create a home-like atmosphere.

Maria House - \$1,000.00, Health care for women and children at the Maria House

To ensure that the women and children at Maria House have access to health care (dental, vision, prescriptions, over-the-counter medications, etc.); and safe and healthy living environment.

Multi-Cultural Family Center - \$1,000.00, "Learning Diversity"

To encourage the education and acceptance of diverse people in Dubuque with books and other learning materials.

Northeast Iowa Community College - \$1,800.00, S.A.A.V.E Stop Adolescent Alcohol Violation Effort

To address the issue of juvenile drug and alcohol use.

St. Mark Community Center - \$2,380.00, Friday Fun Days, an expansion of the St. Mark Summer School Program

To give at-risk children the opportunity to visit educational places in Dubuque that are otherwise inaccessible to them because their families have limited financial resources and lack transportation.

Stonehill Franciscan Services - \$500.00, Door handles/levers for Handicapped Accessibility

To assist first floor residents with remaining as independent as possible and as long as possible by providing essential door handles that they can manage on their own.
